He actually had a little office set up in his hospital room by the evening of the ablation!! After the ablation, his heart was in regular rhythm and we were rejoicing! By 7:00 p.m. of the same day, he was back in AFib. This was a disappointment, but we are told that it is not unusual. The doctor prescribed a medication that could help him go back into regular rhythm. We are told that it works 50% of the time with post-surgery patients. We are praying that this will be the case with Tim so that another ablation will not be necessary.
